

FISHING REPORT

Thursday 8th September 2022

Discover
EAST GIPPSLAND

Lakes Entrance	At the footbridge for barracuda and whiting on the usual baits. Try the town jetties for trevally taking metal lures and blue bait. Surf beaches for salmon and tailor, on pilchards and poppers. Offshore at Six Mile Reef for pinkie snapper and gummy shark.
Lake Tyers	The entrance is closed. Perch and bream are in the upper reaches, flathead, around the 55cm mark, are hunting around the banks chasing soft plastics.
Mitchell River	From the Grassy Banks, towards the Two Bells is best for bream. Mullet and tailor are also about.
Tambo River	The river is producing good fish from Punt House up towards the Cliff's, best results with prawn and soft plastics.
Nicholson	From the Highway and Railway Bridges up to the Car Bodies and the Strait Six for bream, biting on soft shell, spider crab and worm.
Metung	There is some bream active around the town jetties, skipjack are also about, preferred baits are prawn and lures.
Paynesville	Plenty of tailor chasing hard bodied lures, mullet can also be found using worm and pipis.
Holland's Landing	For bream try Tom's Creek, Blonde Bay and Griffin Point, best baits are soft shell, prawn and cut crab.
Marlo	Lake Corringale is still producing good bream, on peeled prawn. Surf beaches and on the incoming tide for salmon and tailor taking pilchards and poppers.
Bemm River	Best spots for bream are the lake, try local prawn. The Channel is still landing good salmon with metal lures.
Tamboon Inlet	The river for bream on shrimp and cut crab, Peter's Rock for trevally using blue bait, and Western Bay for pinky snapper biting on blue bait.
Mallacoota	Top and bottom lakes and the main channel for bream and flathead, best results using prawn, soft shell and plastics. Surf beaches for tailor and salmon.
Omeo High Country	Try the Mitta Mitta, Anglers Rest, Cobungra and give the Gibbo a go, using floating worm, spinners and wobblers and fly patience's.
